1. The author indicates which of the following about the Information Explosion?
 - It may result in an overreliance on technology.
 - It will eventually saturate the world's capacity for knowledge.
 - Its major effect has been felt in the field of inventions.
 - Its growth rate shows no signs of slowing down.

Strategy: This question asks you to identify information explicitly stated in the passage. The passage does not mention an overreliance on technology or knowledge saturation, so choices A and B are incorrect. The passage only briefly mentions inventions, so choice C is incorrect as well. The best answer is choice D because the first four sentences in the passage highlight how the Information Explosion has an incredible growth rate that is only increasing.

QUICK TIP

Inference questions often combine other skills. For example, one of the questions asks you to infer, while another tests you on the skill of determining purpose. (See Lesson 5.)
